Student Learning

Objectives

- Increase in student achievement in 7th & 8th Grades, as measured by a 10% increase in ACAP scores in both reading and math.
- Increase in student achievement as measured by a 2 point increase in composite ACT score from the previous year.
- Students will leave Walter Wellborn High School prepared for college and career upon graduation.

Critical Initiatives

- Block schedule will add approximately 30 minutes of daily instructional time to Math and ELA classes. This equates to approximately 90 days of additional instruction.
- Teachers will incorporate a benchmarking and intervention software, iReady, into their daily lessons.

Teaching & Learning

Objectives

- Teachers will improve overall effectiveness, measured by teachers observations, surveys, and collaboration with peers in and out of the building.

Critical Initiatives

- Professional Development will be tailored to improve Tier 1 instruction in all classes.

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- Offering an ACT Prep course of 10th and 11th grade students to allow targeted practice for ACT.
- WWHS will pay for dual enrollment courses through Gadsden State or Jacksonville State University for students meeting the criteria for acceptance into those programs.
- Increase enrollment at Calhoun County Career Academy, as well as elective programs at WWHS, will expose students to career opportunities they would not otherwise have in a tradition classroom setting.
